In compliance with a written request received <u>01-16</u>, 19<u>85</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>Senate Bill 108</u> pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

Description of Proposed Legislation:

Senate Bill 108 revises the highway speed restrictions; establishing a \$5 fine for speeding over 55 miles per hours, but less than 71 miles per hour and prohibiting recording of such offense; speeding of 71 miles per hour or more would be subject to penalties as stated in section 61-8-711, MCA; repeals the fuel conservation speed limit; amends sections, 61-8-303, 61-8-718, and 61-11-103, MCA; and repeals sections, 61-8-304 through 61-8-307 and 61-8-312,MCA.

Fiscal Impact:

The fiscal impact of this bill cannot be determined for the following reasons:

- 1. Data is not collected on the speed at which speeding citations are given.
- 2. The number of citations and resulting fines for speeding 71 miles per hour or more cannot be determined.
