4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL
 5 COMPENSATION FOR A COUNTY CLERK AND RECORDER WHO SERVES AS
 6 ELECTION ADMINISTRATOR; AMENDING SECTION 7-4-2503, MCA; AND
 7 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 Section 1. Section 7-4-2503, MCA, is amended to read:

11 "7-4-2503. Salary schedule for certain county
 12 officers. (1) The salary paid to the county treasurer,
 13 county clerk and recorder, clerk of the district court,
 14 part-time county attorney, county assessor, county
 15 superintendent of schools, and county sheriff; the county
 16 surveyor in counties where county surveyors receive salaries
 17 as provided in 7-4-2812; and the county auditor in all
 18 counties wherein such office is authorized, for the fiscal
 19 year beginning July 1, 1981, is computed by adding the
 20 annual base salary of:

21 (a) \$14,000 for the counties of the first through
 22 fifth class to the population increment of \$10 for each 100
 23 persons or major fraction thereof included in the county's
 24 population as determined by the 1980 federal decennial
 25 census; or

1 (b) \$12,000 for counties of the sixth and seventh
 2 class to the population increment of \$20 per 100 persons or
 3 major fraction thereof in the county's population as
 4 determined by the 1980 federal decennial census.

5 (2) (a) The county superintendent of schools shall
 6 receive, in addition to the salary based upon subsection
 7 (1), the sum of \$400 per year.

8 (b) The county sheriff shall receive, in addition to
 9 the salary based upon subsection (1), the sum of \$2,000 per
 10 year.

11 (c) A county clerk and recorder who is designated as
 12 election administrator shall receive, in addition to the
 13 salary based upon subsection (1), the sum of \$2,000 per
 14 year.

15 ~~(c)~~(d) In counties with a population less than 30,000,
 16 the county attorney who is a part-time official shall
 17 receive, in addition to the salary based upon subsection
 18 (1), the sum of \$1,200 per year. In each county with a
 19 population in excess of 30,000, the county attorney shall be
 20 a full-time official under 7-4-2704, and his salary for the
 21 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, shall be \$36,500.

22 ~~(d)~~(e) In those counties where the office of the
 23 county attorney has been established as a full-time position
 24 pursuant to 7-4-2706, the salary of the county attorney for
 25 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, shall be \$36,500.

1 Beginning on July 1, 1982, and on July 1 of each succeeding
 2 year, each county attorney shall be entitled to an increase
 3 in salary calculated by adding to his annual salary on July
 4 1, 1981, an increment of 70% of the last previous calendar
 5 year's consumer price index for all urban consumers, U.S.
 6 department of labor, bureau of labor statistics, or other
 7 index that the bureau of business and economic research of
 8 the university of Montana may in the future recognize as the
 9 successor to that index. The cost-of-living increment for
 10 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1983, and for each
 11 subsequent fiscal year shall be added to all cost-of-living
 12 increments granted for previous years.

13 ~~(e)~~(f) For each 10th year after the fiscal year
 14 beginning July 1, 1981, the latest federal decennial census
 15 statistics shall be the basis for computation of population
 16 increments under this section. During the intervening 9
 17 years, the computation of population increments applicable
 18 on July 1 of each year shall be based on the last calendar
 19 year's annual estimates of counties' populations compiled by
 20 the federal-state cooperative program for estimates of the
 21 university of Montana bureau of business and economic
 22 research and the U.S. bureau of the census or other estimate
 23 that the bureau of business and economic research may
 24 certify."

25 NEW SECTION. Section 2. Effective date. This act is

INTRODUCED BY MCCALLUM

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL
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surveyor in counties where county surveyors receive salaries
as provided in 7-4-2812; and the county auditor in all

annual base salary of:

(a) \$14,000 for the counties of the first through
fifth class to the population increment of \$10 for each 100
persons or major fraction thereof included in the county's
population as determined by the 1980 federal decennial
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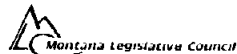
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(b) The county sheriff shall receive, in addition to
the salary based upon subsection (1), the sum of \$2,000 per
year.

(c) A county clerk and recorder who is designated as
election administrator shall MAY receive, in addition to the
salary based upon subsection (1), NOT TO EXCEED the sum of
\$2,000 per year.

(d) In counties with a population less than 30,000,
the county attorney who is a part-time official shall
receive, in addition to the salary based upon subsection
(1), the sum of \$1,200 per year. In each county with a
population in excess of 30,000, the county attorney shall be
a full-time official under 7-4-2704, and his salary for the
fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, shall be \$36,500.

(e) In those counties where the office of the
county attorney has been established as a full-time position
pursuant to 7-4-2706, the salary of the county attorney for
the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, shall be \$36,500.



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
