## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Amend the laws relating to fishing, hunting, trapping, and camping licenses as they relate to various classes of licensees. Changing the age requirement to purchase a golden years camping permit.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

- 3% of population is over 61 but less than 65. All individuals that are eligible for disability under old definition would also be eligible under the new definition.
- Sections 2 through 6 have no fiscal impact.
