

Dear Senator Norman and Representative Vincent:

In accordance with the power vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Montana, I hereby veto Senate Bill No. 205, "AN ACT CLARIFYING THE COMPENSATION OF COAL BOARD MEMBERS; AMENDING SECTION 90-6-204, MCA; AND PROVIDING A RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY DATE AND AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

As passed, Senate Bill No. 205 provides that each member of the coal board is entitled to be paid \$50 for each day in which he performs board duties. The effect of this bill is to allow coal board members who are local and state government employees to receive the \$50 whether or not they are receiving their regular pay. The clear result of Senate Bill No. 205 is to allow "double-dipping"!

The provision which applies the act retroactively (section 3) results in allowing public employees to "double-dip" back to June 30, 1984 -- a purpose which makes the whole idea even more unacceptable. When a person accepts a board appointment he understands his responsibilities and knows the amount of compensation to which he'll be entitled. Reaching into the tax-payers' pocket for services rendered in the past is unacceptable public policy.

Without this bill, members of the coal board will receive the same compensation under 2-15-124(7) as members of other state boards. Senate Bill No. 205 is not in the public interest nor does it serve the best interest of public employees.

For the above reasons, I hereby veto Senate Bill No. 205.
