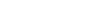

Donated services must be valued at the standard prevailing rate of wages and travel allowance provisions applicable to the county or locality in which the work is being performed as that term is defined in 18-2-401(5) and determined in 18-2-402.

(v) "Volunteer services" include those services to a candidate or political committee provided by a person who is not receiving financial reimbursement from a candidate or political action committee.

(d) filing fee paid by candidates;

(e) nonreimbursed payments for transportation expenses made by an individual in volunteering services to a candidate; and


