BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 8 9 Section 1. Section 61-10-121, MCA, is amended to read: "61-10-121. Permits for excess size and weight. (1) 10 The department of highways and local authorities in their 11 respective jurisdictions may in their discretion, upon 12 application in writing and with good cause shown, issue a 13 special permit in writing authorizing the applicant to 14 operate or move a vehicle, combination of vehicles, load, 15 object, or other thing of a size or weight exceeding the 16 maximum specified in 61-10-101 through 61-10-110 upon a 17 highway under the jurisdiction of and for the maintenance of 18 which the body granting the permit is responsible. However, 19 only the department has the discretion to issue permits for 20 movement of a vehicle or combination of vehicles carrying 21 built-up or reducible loads in excess of 9 feet in width or 22 exceeding the length, height, or weight specified in 23 61-10-101 through 61-10-110. This permit shall be issued in 24 the public interest. A carrier receiving this permit must 25

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have public liability and property damage insurance for the 1 protection of the traveling public as a whole. A permit may 2 not be issued for a period of time greater than the period 3 for which the GVW license is valid as provided in this 4 title, including grace periods allowed by this title. Owners 5 of vehicles licensed in other jurisdictions may, at the 6 discretion of the department, purchase permits to expire 7 with their registration. A license required by the state 8 governs the issuance of a special permit. The department may 9 issue oversize permits to dealers in implements of husbandry 10 and self-propelled machinery, which may be transferred from 11 unit to unit by the dealer, for the fee set forth in 12 13 61-10-124. If upon receipt of the fee the department approves issuance of oversize permits to a dealer, the 14 department shall issue original permits for all vehicles of 15 the dealership. These oversize permits may not restrict 16 dealers in implements of husbandry and self-propelled 17 machinery from traveling on a Saturday or Sunday. These 18 oversize permits expire on December 31 of each year, with no 19 20 grace period. For the purposes of this section, a dealer in 21 implements of husbandry or self-propelled machinery must be 22 a resident of the state. A post-office box number is not a permanent address under this section. 23

24 (2) The applicant for a special permit shall25 specifically describe the powered vehicle or towing vehicle

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and generally describe the type of vehicle, combination of vehicles, load, object, or other thing to be operated or moved and the particular state highways over which the vehicle, combination of vehicles, load, object, or other thing is to be moved and whether the permit is required for a single trip or for continuous operation."

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 2. Extension of authority. Any 8 existing authority of the department of highways to make 9 rules on the subject of the provisions of this act is 10 extended to the provisions of this act.
