Section 53-4-503, MCA, is amended to read: 12 "53-4-503, Powers and duties of the department. 13 14 (1) The department shall: (1) issue licenses to persons to receive children 15 16 into a dav-care center on a regular basis; (2)(b) prescribe the conditions and publish minimum 17 standards upon which licenses and registration certificates 18 19 are issued; t9t(c) adopt rules for day-care facilities consistent 20 21 with the purposes of this part; and (4)(d) issue registration certificates to a person or 22 persons to receive children into a family day-care home or 23 24 group day-care home on a regular basis. (2) The department may contract with other public 25

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agencies or with private organizations to provide 1 2 information to parents and to provide information, technical 3 assistance, and training to existing and prospective licensees and registrants, as required by 53-4-511." 4 5 Section 2. Section 53-4-511, MCA, is amended to read: "53-4-511. Periodic visits to facilities by department 6 -- investigations -- consultation--with---licensees---and 7 я registrants dissemination of information. (1)The q department or its authorized representative shall make 10 periodic visits to all licensed day-care centers to ensure 11 that minimum standards are maintained. 12 (2) The department may investigate, and inspect the 13 conditions and qualifications of any day-care center, group 14 day-care home, or family day-care home seeking or holding a 15 license or registration certificate under the provisions of 16 this part. 17 (3) The department must visit and inspect at least 15% of all registered family day-care homes and group day-care 18 homes in each of the governor's planning regions annually. 19 (4) Upon request of the department, the department of 20 21 health and environmental sciences or the state fire marshal or his designee shall inspect any day care facility for 22 which a license or registration certificate is applied for 23 or issued and shall report its findings to the department. 24 25 (5) Upon--request;--the The department or its agent

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shall give-consultation-to-every-licensee-and-registrant-who 1 desires-to-upgrade-the-services-of-his-program.: 2 3 (a) provide, on request, information, technical 4 assistance, and training to licensees and registrants and to any person who proposes to license or register a day-care 5 facility in Montana; and 6 (b) establish in each county at least one outlet 7 8 through which any parent or other interested person may 9 conveniently obtain current information about registered and 10 licensed day-care facilities in his area." NEW SECTION. Section 3. Extension of authority. Any 11 existing authority of the department of social and 12 rehabilitation services to make rules on the subject of the 13 provisions of this act is extended to the provisions of this 14 15 act.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 4. Effective date. This act is 17 effective July 1, 1985.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 312 requires the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services to provide information about local day care facilities to parents and others and assistance to licensees and prospective licensees.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Approximately 900 licensed/registered day care facilities in Montana.
- 2. There are approximately 8,000 children in licensed or registered day care.
- 3. The department would contract with private organizations to provide information, technical assistance and training.
- 4. 8 districts which would need training or technical assistance.
- 5. \$9,000 per district would provide funds enough to train the day care providers in each district.
- 6. 1 FTE at state level to negotiate, monitor, coordinate and supervise the training contracts.
- 7. To comply with the requirement that at least one outlet be established in each county, the contracts would identify a phone number and responsible person in each county to supply current information about day care (not necessarily an SRS person).
- 8. Only the funds specifically appropriated for this bill would be available for contracts.
