Anhydrous ammonia nurse tank. 10 11 The term "anhydrous ammonia nurse tank" means a farm 12 wagon-type tank vehicle of not over 3,000-gallon capacity as an interim field storage tank supplying the 13 used fertilizer to a field applicator and moved on a road or 14 15 highway only when bringing the fertilizer from a local 16 source of supply to farms or fields or from one farm or 17 field to another.

18 Section 2. Section 61-3-431, MCA, is amended to read: 19 "61-3-431. Special mobile equipment -- exemption from 20 registration and payment of fees and charges --21 identification plate -- publicly owned special mobile 22 equipment. (1) A person, firm, partnership, or corporation 23 who owns, leases, or rents special mobile equipment as 24 defined in 61-1-104(2) and occasionally moves that equipment 25 on, over, or across the highways of the state is not subject

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to registration of that equipment or required to pay the fees and charges provided for in 61-3-502, 61-4-301 through 61-4-308, or part 2 of chapter 10. Prior to movement on the highways, however, each piece of equipment shall display an equipment identification plate or a dealer's license plate attached to the equipment.

7 (2) Annual application for the identification plate 8 shall be made to the county treasurer before any piece of equipment is moved on the highways. Application shall be 9 10 made on a form furnished by the department of justice. together with the payment of a fee of \$5. The equipment for 11 12 which a special mobile equipment plate is sought is subject 13 to the assessment of personal property taxes on the date application is made for the plate. The personal property 14 taxes assessed against the special mobile equipment must be 15 paid before the issuance of a special mobile equipment 16 17 plate. The fees collected under this section belong to the 18 county road fund.

It is the intent of the legislature that, although the 9 department of agriculture is the agency responsible for 10 administering the anhydrous ammonia safety program, it shall 11 coordinate closely with other appropriate agencies in 12 adopting and implementing rules for safety standards. Rules 13 adopted must be only those which are reasonably necessary 14 for the protection and safety of the public and particularly 15 16 those persons handling and using anhydrous ammonia.
