 4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT LIMITING THE EXEMPTION
 5 OF THE OFFICE OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION
 6 FROM CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS RELATING TO DATA PROCESSING;
 7 AMENDING SECTION 2-17-501, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE
 8 DATE."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11 Section 1. Section 2-17-501, MCA, is amended to read:
 12 "2-17-501. Responsibilities of director of department
 13 of administration for data processing. (1) Except as
 14 provided in subsection (2), the director of the department
 15 shall:

16 (a) establish policies and a statewide plan, in
 17 cooperation with state agencies, for the operation and
 18 development of data processing for state government;

19 (b) review and approve agency specifications and
 20 procurement methods for the acquisition of data processing
 21 equipment, excluding specifications and methods relating to
 22 instruction and research in the university system, to insure
 23 network compatibility and conformity with the statewide data
 24 processing plan;

25 (c) review and approve all contracts for private

1 sector data processing services to insure conformance with
 2 the statewide data processing plan; and

3 (d) operate and maintain a central computer center and
 4 a data processing equipment pool for the use of all state
 5 agencies and political subdivisions.

6 (2) The responsibilities of the director under this
 7 section subsection (1)(b) do not apply to the office of the
 8 superintendent of public instruction, and that office is
 9 exempt from the requirements of this-section subsection
 10 (1)(b) unless a proposed activity of that office related to
 11 data processing affects the operation of the central
 12 computer center and data processing equipment pool. If the
 13 office of the superintendent of public instruction
 14 determines that such an impact may occur, it shall notify
 15 the director, and the proposed activity shall be subject to
 16 the requirements of subsection (1)(b)."

17 NEW SECTION. Section 2. Effective date. This act is
 18 effective July 1, 1985.
