In compliance with a written request received February $12 \quad 19 \quad 85$, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for S.B. 362 pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 362 raises the state minimum wage to $\$ 3.05$ an hour effective October 1 , 1985 , and to $\$ 3.35$ an hour effective October 1, 1986.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Raising the state minimum wage as provided for in Senate Bill 362 would match the federal minimum wage by October 1, 1986 if the federal minimum wage is not raised before then
2. All state employees are currently paid at least the federal minimum wage.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

No fiscal impact.

## AFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUE OR EXPENDITURES:

There may be some local impact because many localities pay current state minimum wages to some park and recreation department employees.
