Purpose of state equalization aid and 12 13 duties of the board of public education for distribution. 14 (1) The money available for state equalization aid shall be distributed and apportioned to provide an annual minimum 15 operating revenue for the elementary and high schools in 16 each county, exclusive of revenues required for debt service 17 and for the payment of any and all costs and expense 18 incurred in connection with any adult education program, 19 20 recreation program, school food services program, new buildings, new grounds, and transportation. 21

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4 (b) have the power to require such reports from the 5 <u>superintendent of public instruction</u>, the county 6 superintendents, budget boards, county treasurers, and 7 trustees as it may deem necessary; and

я (c) order the superintendent of public instruction to 9 distribute the state equalization aid on the basis of each 10 district's annual entitlement to such aid as established by 11 the superintendent of public instruction. In ordering the 12 distribution of state equalization aid, the board of public education shall not increase or decrease the state 13 equalization aid distribution to any district on account of 14 15 any difference which may occur during the school fiscal year 16 between budgeted and actual receipts from any other source 17 of school revenue.

18 (3) Should a district receive more state equalization 19 aid than it is entitled to, the county treasurer must return 20 the overpayment to the state upon the request of the 21 superintendent of public instruction in the manner 22 prescribed by the department of commerce."
