In compliance with a written request received <u>February 14</u>, <u>19</u><u>85</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>S.B. 387</u> pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to require police and emergency vehicles to carry a portable green signal light for purposes of designation as the on-scene command and control vehicle in an emergency or disaster.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There are 219 highway patrol cars, 400 Division of Forestry vehicles, 25 livestock inspector vehicles, 67 game warden trucks and over 200 ambulances. The number of city police cars and county sheriff vehicles is unknown.

A non-flashing magnetic light costs \$50. Of the known vehicles which will be mandated to carry a light, the cost is \$45,550 (911 x \$50). These costs would be borne by the general funds, earmarked, and federal funds as well as the city and county funds.

LOCAL IMPACTS:

There are costs associated with the bill which will cause increased expenditures for the cities and counties.

LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

There will be some on-going costs to replace damaged and worn out lights.
