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> A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT DEFINING "ORDINARY HIGH-WATER MARK"."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. "Ordinary high-water mark" defined. For the purpose of determining the limits of the public's right to recreational use of a water body, "ordinary high-water mark" is the line that water has impressed on soil by covering it for sufficient periods of time to deprive the soil of its vegetation and to destroy its value for agricultural purposes. Flood plains or flood channels are not considered to lie between the ordinary high-water marks, for recreational purposes, except when they carry sufficient water to support fishing or floating.
