Sanzle BILL NO. 430 1 INTRODUCED BY 2 3 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO MANDATE THE CREATION 4 OF AN ADVISORY COUNCIL TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ADOPTION 5 OF SAFETY RULES FOR THE COAL MINING INDUSTRY; TO REQUIRE THE 6 DIVISION OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION TO ADOPT CERTAIN RULES 7 REGARDING COAL MINE SAFETY AND TO PURSUE FEDERAL FUNDING; 8 AMENDING SECTION 50-73-103, MCA." 9 10 WHEREAS, employees in the coal mining industry in 11 Montana, both underground and open pit, are daily exposed to 12 potential hazards such as: 13 (1) explosions from methane gas, especially in 14 enclosures such as silos and other storage facilities; 15 (2) explosions from coal dust; 16 (3) highwall cave-ins; 17 danger from heavy equipment slipping on ice; 18 (4) (5) electrocution from electrical lines, including 19 lines carrying as much as 7,200 volts, lying around the 20 21 mine:

(6) injury from the handling and blasting ofexplosives; and

24 (7) danger from the explosion of large tires used on25 ore hauling equipment, which is capable of inflicting fatal

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injuries from 200 yards.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

MEW SECTION. Section 1. Short title. [This act] may
be cited as the "Montana Coal Mine Safety Act of 1985".

Section 2. Section 50-73-103, MCA, is amended to read:

7 "50-73-103. Division authorized to adopt rules. (1)
8 The division may adopt rules to carry out the provisions of
9 this chapter and safety standards for all coal mines in this
10 state.

11 (2) The commissioner of labor and industry shall appoint an advisory council, pursuant to 2-15-122, composed of equal numbers of employers and employees within the coal industry to make recommendations for adoption, amendment, or revision of safety standards for all coal mines in the state.
17 (3) The division shall adopt rules requiring

18 certification of shot firers involved in coal mining and 19 requiring mine foremen to have a basic knowledge of blasting 20 material."

21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 3. Duty of division to secure 22 funding in addition to state funds. The division shall 23 vigorously pursue funding sources beyond money available 24 through state funding sources, such as grants from the 25 federal mine safety and health administration, in order to

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better discharge its duties of enforcement of occupational
 and industrial safety laws.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 4. Codification instruction. 4 Section 3 is intended to be codified as an integral part of 5 Title 50, chapter 73, part 1, and the provisions of Title 6 50, chapter 73, apply to section 3.

B. 430 pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). ### Description of Proposed Legislation

"An Act to mandate the creation of an advisory council to make recommendations for adoption of safety rules for the coal mining industry; to require the Division of Workers' Compensation to adopt certain rules regarding coal mine safety and to pursue federal funding."

### Assumptions

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- 1. Council will consist of six members, three representing organized coal industry employees, and three representing coal industry employers.
- 2. Council members will each travel 800 miles per meeting.
- 3. The council will meet four times a year.
- 4. Each meeting, including travel time, will last three days.
- 5. Council members will be paid a \$25/day honorarium.
