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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT EXEMPTING NONPROFIT SERVICE, CIVIC. FRATERNAL. RELIGIOUS, AND CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS FROM CERTAIN GAMBLING LAWS; PROVIDING SPECIAL LICENSING REQUIREMENTS: AND AMENDING SECTIONS 23-5-202 AND 23-5-503, MCA."

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BE IT FNACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 10

NEW SECTION, Section 1. Charitable organizations 11 conducting card games. (1) Conducting or participating in 12 card games by nonprofit service, civic, fraternal, 13 religious, and charitable organizations is lawful, and the 14 card games are exempt from the provisions of 23-5-321 and 15 23-5-322. 16

(2) The premises upon which card games are conducted under this section must be licensed by the secretary of state upon payment of a license fee in an amount commensurate with the cost of processing and issuing the license.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Statewide raffles by certain 22 23 organizations authorized. (1) The conducting of statewide raffles by nonprofit service, civic, fraternal, religious, 24 and charitable organizations and participation in the 25

raffles is lawful, and the raffles are exempt from the

provisions of part 2 of this chapter. Such conducting and

participation are also exempt from the provisions of this

part, except that 23-5-402(1)(b) and (2)(b), 23-5-416, and

23-5-423 apply.

(2) Each raffle must be licensed by the secretary of state upon payment of a license fee in an amount

commensurate with the cost of processing and issuing the

license.

(3) A person who knowingly violates this section or a 10 provision of this part applying to statewide raffles commits 11 a criminal offense and may be fined not to exceed \$1,000. 12

Section 4. Section 23-5-503, MCA, is amended to read:

"23-5-503. Rules. (1) The card used for recording the

pool and upon which the squares or spaces appear shall

clearly state in advance of the sale of any chances the

number of chances to be sold in that specific pool, the name

of the event, the consideration to be paid for each chance,

and the total amount to be paid to the winners.

(2) No chance to participate in a sports pool may be sold other than upon the premises in which the sports pool is conducted. No individual chance to participate in a sports pool shall be sold for a consideration in excess of \$1, and the total amount to be paid to the winners of any individual sports pool shall not exceed the value of \$100. The winner of any sports pool shall receive a 100% payout of the value of the sports pool, except that a nonprofit service, civic, fraternal, religious, or charitable organization conducting a sports pool may retain up to one-half the value and pay out the rest."

NEW SECTION. Section 5. Codification instruction.

Sections 1 and 2 are intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 23, chapter 5, and the provisions of Title 23, chapter 5, apply to sections 1 and 2, except as otherwise stated in sections 1 and 2.

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
