4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE
5 LOCAL GOVERNMENT INITIATIVE PROCESS EXTENDS TO ALL
6 LEGISLATIVE ACTIONS OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT WITH CERTAIN
7 ECONOMIC CONSEQUENCES; AMENDING SECTION 7-5-131, MCA; AND
8 PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

10. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11 Section 1. Section 7-5-131, MCA, is amended to read:

12 "7-5-131. Right of initiative and referendum. (1) The

13 powers of initiative and referendum are reserved to the

14 electors of each local government. Resolutions, and

15 ordinances, and other legislative actions within the

16 legislative jurisdiction and power of the governing body of

17 the local government, except those set out in subsection

18 (2), may be proposed or amended and prior resolutions and

19 ordinances may be repealed in the manner provided in 7-5-132

20 through 7-5-137.

21 (2) The powers of initiative shall not extend to the
22 following:

23 (a) the annual budget;
24 (b) bond proceedings, except for ordinances
25 authorizing bonds:

1 (c) the establishment and collection of charges

2 pledged for the payment of principal and interest on bonds;
3 or

4 (d) the levy of special assessments pledged for the
5 payment of principal and interest on bonds.

6 (3) Any action of a governing body or officer of a
7 local government that would have a total economic
8 consequence greater than the amount of money that would be
9 raised by a property tax of 2 mills levied by such local
10 government is an action within the legislative jurisdiction
11 of the governing body of the local government as that phrase
12 is used in subsection (1) and is subject to the electors'
13 power of initiative."

14 NEW SECTION. Section 2. Effective date. This act is
15 effective on passage and approval.
