A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA TO SEND DELEGATES TO THE WESTERN STATES LEGISLATIVE FORESTRY TASK FORCE.

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WHEREAS, the forests of the Western States play a vital role in the economic development of these states; and

WHEREAS, proper forest management and use are necessary for the protection and conservation of other important resources, such as wildlife, recreation, and scenic beauty; and

WHEREAS, the subjects that require interstate cooperation include but are not limited to insect infestations, conservation, production, and marketing, all of which know no state boundaries.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

That the Committee on Committees of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives appoint two Senators

Montana Legislative Council

and two Representatives, one from each party, to represent
Montana on the Western States Legislative Forestry Task
Force, which operates as a clearinghouse for opinions from
all the various interests involved in the Western States
forests and which includes among its duties a report to the
Legislatures of the participating states and to the state
delegations in the United States Congress concerning means
of protecting and fostering the forests of the participating
states.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Clerk of the
House of Representatives send copies of this resolution to
the presiding officers of the Legislatures of Washington,
Idaho, Oregon, Wyoming, Alaska, and California and to the
Executive Director of the Western States Legislative
Forestry Task Force.
