9 WHILE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF INTOXICANTS.

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11 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes the necessity to 12 protect the public by preventing persons who are under the 13 influence of intoxicants from operating vehicles on the 14 public highways; and

15 WHEREAS, the Designated Driver Program is intended to 16 reduce the incidence of cases of driving while under the 17 influence of intoxicants by encouraging at least one 18 passenger of every vehicle to refrain from using alcoholic 19 beverages so that person may safely operate the vehicle 20 conveying the group; and

21 WHEREAS, the beverage industry has indicated its 22 willingness to participate in this program by providing the 23 designated driver with complimentary nonalcoholic beverages 24 on that occasion or with a coupon redeemable for a 25 complimentary beverage of his choice on a later occasion



when he is not the designated driver and thereby reduce the potential liability of operators of licensed establishments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

6 (1) That the Designated Driver Program offers a
7 significant opportunity to improve traffic safety by
8 reducing hazards caused by intoxicated drivers.

9 (2) That the Legislature encourages any group of . 10 persons participating in an activity involving consumption 11 of alcoholic beverages to act responsibly by designating one 12 member of the group to refrain from drinking alcoholic 13 beverages on that occasion and to operate the vehicle 14 , conveying the group, to avoid endangering the lives of 15 others.

16 (3) That licensed beverage establishments are
17 encouraged to participate in the Designated Driver Program.
18 (4) That the Division of Motor Vehicles cooperate with

19 the beverage industry and with other concerned citizens to

20 publicize the Designated Driver Program.
