## Description of Proposed Legislation:

A bill for an act entitled: "An act returning the salary of legislators to the level in effect prior to the January 1, 1987, effective date of the salary raise enacted by section 3, chapter 693, laws of 1985; amending section 5-2-301. MCA: and providing an effective date."

#### Assumptions:

- The average daily salary of 148 legislators was calculated from the 1986-87 pay matrix (excluding insur-1. ance). The salary of the Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate was increased \$5.00 per day above the base legislative salary.
- Benefits were assumed to equal 8% of salary costs. 2.
- Salaries were calculated for a ninety (90) day period. 3.
- The cost of interim committee salaries was not included, although such salaries would be reduced also 4. beginning January 2, 1987.
