11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
12	Section 1. Article II, section 4, of the Constitution
13	of the State of Hontana is amended to read:
14	"Section 4. Individual dignity. The dignity of the
15	human being is inviolable. No person shall be denied the
16	equal protection of the laws. Neither the state nor any
17	person, firm, corporation, or institution shall discriminate
18	against any person in the exercise of his civil or political
19	rights on account of race, color, sex, culture, social
20	origin or condition, or political or religious ideas.
21	Nothing contained in this section limits the authority of
22	the legislature to enact laws limiting civil liability that
23	are otherwise permitted by Article II. sections 16 and 18.
24	NEW_SECTION: Section 2. Effective date. If approved
25	by the electorate, this amendment is effective January 1.
