Section 1. Section 20-7-324, MCA, is amended to read: 11 "20-7-324. Sources of financing for postsecondary 12 13 vocational-technical center budgets -- superintendent of 14 public instruction administration. (1) The total of the 15 budgets approved by the superintendent of public instruction7--together-with-the-budget-for-the-cost-of-state 16 administration--of--the--postsecondary--vocational-technical 17 18 centersy shall constitute the total maximum approved statewide vocational-technical center system budget which 19 20 shall be financed as follows:

(a) The primary source of financing is to be those
funds specifically designated by legislative enactment or
referendum by the people for financing postsecondary
vocational-technical education in Montana.

The funds earned by the mill levy specified in 13 subsection (1)(b) shall be credited by-the-county-treasurer to the postsecondary vocational-technical center fund ۱4 .5 account in the unrestricted subfund of the current fund in .6 the state treasury.

.7 (3) The superintendent of public instruction shall determine the amount of financing available from these four 18 ٤9 sources of revenue and may approve budgets for maintenance and --- operation --- construction --- and --- ancillary -- services 50· 21 instruction, plant operations and maintenance, equipment, and support. The aggregate amount of the budgets so approved 22 by the superintendent of public instruction 23 for 24 postsecondary vocational-technical centers shall not exceed the moneys determined to be available." 25
