In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB010, third reading .

Description of Proposed Legislation:

A bill for an act entitled: "An act providing that the first payment of state equalization aid to school districts be distributed by July 15 of the school fiscal year and be based on an estimate of 20 percent of each district's entitlement; amending section 20-9-344, MCA; and providing a contingent effective date."

Assumptions:

- 1. Five equal payments of state equalization aid will be made beginning July 15 of a school fiscal year.
- 2. The state general fund will lose interest earnings on \$26.3 million due to accelerating payments from September 30 to July 15.

Fiscal Impact:

The fiscal impact of accelerated payments of state equalization aid to school districts will decrease general fund interest earnings \$389,000 in FY87.
