INTRODUCED BY LINE TO COLLEGE AND ACT TRANSFERRING MONEY FOR HOME

THE GENERAL FUND AND PROVIDING FOR RETRANSFER UNDER CERTAIN

CONDITIONS; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

WHEREAS, Article IX, section 5, of the Montana Constitution allows the transfer of money from the Permanent Coal Tax Trust by vote of three-fourths of the members of each house of the Legislature.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Transfer. Subject to the provisions of 17-5-703(2) relating to principal and interest payments on bonds, there is transferred to the general fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1987, \$39,000,000 from the money flowing into the trust established under Article IX, section 5, of the Montana Constitution.

Section 2. Intention to retransfer unexpended balance. It is the intent of the Legislature to retransfer from the general fund to the trust established under Article IX, section 5, of the Montana Constitution \$39,000,000 or so much thereof as equals the amount by which total deposits to

the general fund during the fiscal year ending June 30,

Section 3. Three-fourths vote required. Since this act
