 9 SECTION 5-11-105, MCA."

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

12 Section 1. Section 5-11-105, MCA, is amended to read:

13 "5-11-105. Powers and duties of council. (1) If a
 14 question of statewide importance arises when the legislature
 15 is not in session and a subcommittee has not been appointed
 16 to consider the question, the legislative council shall
 17 assign the question to an appropriate subcommittee as
 18 provided in Title 5, chapter 5, part 2, or to the
 19 appropriate statutorily created committee.

20 (2) The legislative council shall supervise the
 21 activities of the council staff.

22 (3) The legislative council shall assist in the
 23 preparation and submission of all standing and select
 24 committee and subcommittee reports and recommendations to
 25 the legislature.

1 (4) This section shall not be construed to permit the
 2 council to approve or disapprove of any substantive portions
 3 or recommendations of a standing or select committee or
