| 9 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: |
| 10 | Section 1. Section 87-1-304, MCA, is amended to read: |
| 11 | "87-1-304. Fixing of seasons and bag and possession |
| 12 | limits. (1) The commission may fix seasons, bag limits, |
| 13 | possession limits, and season limits; open or close or |
| 14 | shorten or lengthen seasons on any species of game, bird, |
| 15 | fish, or fur-bearing animal as defined by 87-2-101; and |
| 16 | declare areas open to the hunting of deer, antelope, elk, |
| 17 | moose, sheep, and goat by bow and arrow permit holders and |
| 18 | designate times when only bows and arrows may be used to |
| 19 | hunt deer, antelope, elk, moose, sheep, and goat in those |
| 20 | areas. It may declare areas open to deer hunting where |
| 21 | shotguns only may be used to hunt or kill deer. In areas |
| 22 | where deer hunting is open to the use of shotguns only, the |
| 23 | commission may authorize the use of muzzleloaders (rifled or |
| 24 | smoothbore). It may declare areas open to special license |
| 25 | holders only and issue special licenses in a limited number |



1 when it determines, after proper investigation, that such a season is necessary to assure the maintenance of an adequate 2 supply of game birds, fish, or animals or fur-bearing 3 4 animals. It may declare a special season and issue special licenses when game birds or animals or fur-bearing animals 5 are causing damage to private property or when written 6 complaint of such damage has been filed with the commission 7 by the owner of that property. In determining to whom those 8 licenses shall be issued, it may, when more applications are 9 received than the number of animals to be killed, award 10 permits to those chosen under a drawing system. The 11 procedures used for awarding the permits from the drawing 12 13 system shall be determined by the commission.

14 (2) The commission may adopt rules governing the use
15 of livestock and vehicles by archers during special archery
16 seasons.

17 (3) It may divide the state into fish and game 18 districts and create fish, game, or fur-bearing animal 19 districts throughout the state. It may declare closed season 20 for hunting, fishing, or trapping in any of those districts 21 and later may open those districts to hunting, fishing, or 22 trapping.

(4) It may declare a closed season on any species of
game, fish, game birds, or fur-bearing animals threatened
with undue depletion from any cause. It may close any area

1 or district of any stream, public lake, or public water or portions thereof to hunting, trapping, or fishing for 2 3 limited periods of time, when necessary to protect a recently stocked area, district, water, spawning waters, 4 spawn-taking waters, or spawn-taking stations or to prevent 5 the undue depletion of fish, game and fur-bearing animals, 6 7 and game and nongame birds. It later may open the area or 8 district upon consent of a majority of the property owners 9 affected.

10 (5) The commission may authorize the director to open 11 or close any special season upon 12 hours' notice to the 12 public.

13 (6) It may declare certain fishing waters closed to
14 fishing except by persons under 13 years of age. The purpose
15 of this subsection is to provide suitable fishing waters for
16 the exclusive use and enjoyment of juveniles under 13 years
17 of age, at times and in areas the commission in its
18 discretion considers advisable and consistent with its
19 policies relating to fishing.

20 (7) To ensure the survival of the black bear and 21 mountain lion species within the state, the commission shall 22 establish a quota for any area in which it permits the 23 pursuit, hunting, shooting, and killing of black bear or 24 mountain lion."

25 NEW SECTION. Section 2. Extension of authority. Any

existing authority of the fish and game commission to make
 rules on the subject of the provisions of this act is
 extended to the provisions of this act.

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 3. Effective date. This act is 5 effective March 1, 1988.

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB033, as originally introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A bill for an act entitled: "An act to require establishment of quotas for hunting black bear and mountain lion; amending Section 87-1-304, MCA; and providing an effective date."

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The quotas will be administered similar to the way grizzly bear hunting is permitted. Quotas would be established based upon kill. Once the harvest is reached the season is closed.
- 2. Past history has shown that additional restrictions cause a reduction in license sales. Black bear licenses are projected to decrease 10%.
- 3. Since mountain lion licenses must be purchased by August 31st, there will be no reduction in mountain lion license sales.
