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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
19	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Powers and duties of board of
20	regents. The board of regents has general administrative and
21	supervisory control over vocational-technical center
22	education and shall:
23	(1) establish and when necessary amend a plan for the
24	orderly development of vocational-technical center education
25	that is consistent with federal and state law, controlled to

prevent unnecessary duplication, and funded to ensure
necessary growth and quality education;

- (2) adopt standards for courses and programs;
- 4 (3) implement a review process for establishing and
  5 deleting programs and courses that recognizes the present
  6 and future needs of employers and provides qualified
  7 graduates for positions for which there is or may in the
  8 near future be a demand:
- 9 (4) establish student entrance and graduation 10 requirements;
- 11 (5) appoint a director, to serve at the pleasure of 12 the board, for each vocational-technical center and 13 establish minimum qualifications for faculty, directors, 14 administrative staff, and other personnel;
- 15 (6) appoint a commissioner of vocational-technical 16 center education, to serve at the pleasure of the board:
- 17 (7) establish student tuition and prescribe the bases
  18 and limitations for charging of fees, taking into account
  19 funding available from all other sources;
- 20 (8) determine the amount to be paid for the lease of 21 buildings;
- 22 (9) adopt budget requests for the vocational-technical
  23 center education system;
  - (10) establish a procedure by which students can receive part of their education and training through

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programs, courses, and on-the-job training offered by the private sector and not available at the centers;

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- (11) establish a procedure by which qualified persons in the private sector can participate in the training and teaching of students in the centers' classrooms when such persons have training, knowledge, and skills not available through the centers' faculty;
- (12) provide means by which the centers' faculty can obtain advanced education and training in new areas and either be reimbursed for their expenses or raised to a higher salary level, or both;
- (13) establish for the various centers uniform policies for recordkeeping; financial transactions; accounting; maintenance; recruiting, quidance, and placement of students; examinations; personnel relations; and other matters as determined by the board;
- (14) negotiate with the bargaining representative for personnel of each center or the personnel of the center system in a manner consistent with state and federal law:
- (15) work with other institutions of higher education to implement the transfer of course credits between those institutions and the vocational-technical centers: and
- 23 (16) adopt rules and procedures to implement this section and to carry out any other powers and duties of the board.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Sole state agency for federal 1 vocational education requirements. The board of regents is the sole state agency for purposes of the 1985 federal Carl D. Perkins Vocational Education Act, 44 U.S.C. 2301, et seg., which requires a state participating in programs under that act to designate a state board or agency as the sole state agency responsible for administration or supervision 7 of the administration of those programs.

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Local advisory boards. The board of trustees of a school district in which a vocational-technical center is located shall appoint a local advisory board, composed of at least five residents of the county where the center is located, to act in an advisory capacity to the center and the board of regents.

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Duties of the commissioner of vocational-technical center education. The commissioner of vocational-technical center education shall, under the rules and policies of the board of regents:

- (1) be the chief administrative officer for the board regents for the administration its vocational-technical center rules and policies;
- (2) employ, within the limits of any legislative appropriation and with the confirmation of the board of regents, the staff necessary for the state supervision and administration of the board's vocational-technical center

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1 rules and policies;

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- 2 (3) provide supervisory and consultative assistance to 3 centers;
- 4 (4) report the status of vocational-technical center 5 education in Montana when requested by the board of regents; 6 and
- 7 (5) perform any other duties assigned by the board of 8 regents.
  - NEW SECTION. Section 5. Existing center employees.

    (1) The rights of persons employed by a vocational-technical center under a collective bargaining agreement in effect prior to July 1, 1989, may not be impaired.
  - (2) A person employed by a center under a school district on June 30, 1989, becomes an employee of the board of regents on July 1, 1989.
  - (3) Following [the effective date of this section], the employees of any center may apply to the board of personnel appeals for determination of the appropriate bargaining unit or units for the purposes of collective bargaining for a contract or contracts to be negotiated with the board of regents prior to July 1, 1989.
  - (4) If a person is employed by a center in any capacity on July 1, 1989, and has accumulated sick, vacation, or other leave and years of service with a school district, such leave and years of service shall be

- transferred fully regardless of the length of employment
  with the district in which the center is located.
- 3 Section 6. Section 19-4-302, MCA, is amended to read:
- 4 "19-4-302. Active membership. (1) Unless otherwise
- 5 provided by this chapter, the following persons must be
- 6 active members of the retirement system, with the exception
- 7 that those persons who became eligible for membership on
- 8 September 1, 1937, or on September 1, 1939, and who elected
- 9 not to become members under the provisions of the law at

thit(9) "Principal" means any person who holds a valid class 3 Montana teacher certificate with an applicable principal's endorsement that has been issued by the superintendent of public instruction under the provisions of this title and the policies adopted by the board of public education and who has been employed by a district as a principal. For the purposes of this title, any reference to a teacher shall be construed as including a principal, as

herein defined.

(12)(10) "Pupil" means any child who is 6 years of age or older on or before September 10 of the year in which the child is to enroll or has been enrolled by special permission of the board of trustees under 20-5-101(3) but has not yet reached his 19th birthday and who is enrolled in a school established and maintained under the laws of the state of Montana at public expense.

9 (±3)(11) "Pupil instruction" means the conduct of 10 organized instruction of pupils enrolled in public schools 11 while under the supervision of a teacher.

(22)(20) "Textbook dealer" means any party, company, corporation, or other organization selling, offering to sell, or offering for adoption textbooks to districts in the state of Montana.

(23)(21) "Trustees" means the governing board of a district.

23 +24+(22) "University" means the university of Montana, 24 located at Missoula.

<del>(25)</del>(23) "Vocational education" means the instruction

to prepare or improve the pupil for gainful employment that does not require a baccalaureate or higher degree. This 3 definition of vocational education shall include guidance prevocational, related, or technical instruction 5 necessary to prepare the pupil for further vocational education or for entry into employment.

7 (24) "Vocational-technical center" means an institution used principally for the provision of vocational-technical education to persons who qualify as vocational-technical students. These centers are designated by the board of 11 regents upon direction by the legislature. All other public 12 or private institutions or schools are hereby prohibited 13 from using this title.

14 (25) "Vocational-technical education" means 15 vocational-technical education of vocational-technical 16 students that is conducted by a vocational-technical center, 17 a unit of the Montana university system, or a community 18 college as designated by the board of regents."

any district shall designate the grade assignments for the

schools of the district, but for the purposes of this title

each school shall be known as:

- (1) an elementary school when it comprises the work of any combination of kindergarten, other preschool programs, or the first eight grades or their equivalents. A middle school is a school comprising the work of grades 4 through 8 or any combination thereof that has been accredited as a middle school under the provisions of 20-7-102. When an accredited junior high school or an accredited 6-year high school is operated by the district, grades 7 and 8 or their equivalents shall not be considered as elementary grades.
- (2) a high school when it comprises the work of one or more grades of schoolwork or their equivalents intermediate between the elementary schools and the institutions of higher education of the state of Montana. Types of high schools shall be designated as follows:

(32) perform any other duty prescribed from time to

(a) a junior high school is a school comprising the work of grades 7 through 9 or their equivalents that has been accredited as a junior high school under the provisions of 20-7-102;

In all sections of the Montana Code Annotated not contained in this act and in all provisions passed by the 50th legislature wherein reference is made to a postsecondary vocational-technical center, the code commissioner shall change the reference to vocational-technical center.

NEW SECTION. Section 31. Effective date. This act is effective July 1, 1987.

#### STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB039, as introduced.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

HB039 transfers governance of the vocational technical centers from the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI), to the Board of Regents of Higher Education.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Federal authority for both secondary and post-secondary vocational education services, office of civil rights responsibilities and sex equity coordination is transferred in total from OSPI to the Board of Regents.
- 2. General fund required for matching federal administration expenditures will follow the sole state agency authority to the Board of Regents from OSPI.
- 3. There will be no net change in administration costs for vocational education.
- 4. State assumed responsibility for Vo-Tech facilities will be through the lease of current property from the school district.
- 5. Current Vo-Tech programs occupy 589,200 square feet of school district property. State funding purchased 32.8% of this space.
- 6. An average lease rate of \$4.15 per square foot will be the negotiated agreement between the Board of Regents and the local school districts.
- 7. The property valuation in the 5 counties containing Vo-Tech Centers will be \$549,215,333 in FY88 and \$562.975,333 in FY89.
- 8. Voted levies are not authorized as of July 1, 1987.
- 9. As of July 1, 1987, Vo-Tech center budgets cannot be expanded beyond legislative appropriations by local school districts.
- 10. Current voted levies total \$1,613,693 in FY87 and would remain constant in the 1989 biennium if the law is not adopted.
- 11. The legislature will replace the lost local budget authority with state budget authority.
- 12. Reductions in voted county levies would offset the 1.5 mill increase in the general county levy.
- 13. Collective bargaining salary levels for Vo-Tech center staff in the 1989 biennium will be tied to the local district's negotiated settlements. This fiscal note assumes that local salaries will be frozen. If salaries increase, a dollar for dollar increase in state general fund cost will occur.

If local salary negotiations exceed the salary increases appropriated by the 1987 Legislature, supplemental funding from the general fund for current level operations might be required in the 89 Biennium. EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUE OR EXPENDITURES:

Local school districts would have increased revenue due to the sale or lease of Vo-Tech facilities. We estimate that this revenue would be \$2,445,180 per year. This increased revenue could reduce property tax levies for the affected districts.

#### LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

The state may be required, in the future, to purchase all Vo-Tech property from the local school district. TECHNICAL OR MECHANICAL DEFECTS IN PROPOSED LEGISLATION OR CONFLICTS WITH EXISTING LEGISLATION:

This legislation transfers responsibility for federal vocational funding to the Board of Regents. As the bill currently reads, OSPI retains responsibility for secondary (K-12) vocational programs. Federal and associated matching funds for secondary (K-12) programs will transfer to the Board of Regents while secondary vo-ed responsibility remains with the Office of Public Instruction. This separation of funding and responsibility should be corrected in the proposed legislation.
