(0) the machine must issue, by activation of an external switch, an accounting ticket containing a performance synopsis of the machine. The ticket must contain:
(i) the name of the licensed establishment;
(ii) the name of the city, town, or county in which the licensed establishment is located;
(iii) the license number of the machine;
(iv) the time of day, in hours and minutes in a 24 -hour format:

(vi) the electronic meter readings required by subsection $(4)(m)=$; and
(5) have a serial number or other identification number permanently affixed to the machine by the manufacturer."

Such disclosure must include but is not limited to any experience in operating such devices, employment with any such establishments, and any violations of state or local gambling laws in any jurisdiction.
(2) A licensee may not have on the premises or make available for play on the premises of his licensed establishment more than five machines.
(3) A person denied a state license has the right to a hearing before the department. The hearing must be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Montana Administrative Procedure Act."

(5) (a) Findings of suspected illegal activity must be reported to the appropriate law enforcement agency.
(b) The clerk of the court shall, upon final judgment of conviction of a licensee, report to the department the name of the licensee convicted of violating a local gambling ordinance.
(c) On receipt of such report, the department may commence proceedings to revoke or suspend the licensee's video poker license.
(6) Any peace officer of this state may arrest a person for tampering with a video draw poker machine, attempting or conspiring to manipulate the outcome or the payoff of a video draw poker machine, or manipulating the outcome or payoff of a video draw poker machine by physical tampering or other interference with the proper functioning of the machine."

NEW SECTION. Section 6. Removal of machine from public access. If a machine fails to meet the specifications and requirements of $23-5-606,23-5-607$, or 23-5-608 at any
time after initial licensure, the licensee shall immediately remove the machine from public access until it meets all requirements.

NEW SECTION. Section 7. Penalties -- hearing. (l) If the department finds reasonable cause to believe a person licensed under this part has violated any of the provisions of this part or the department's rules, the department may, in addition to the other penalties prescribed:
(a) suspend the license for a period of not more than 180 days;
(b) impose a civil penalty not to exceed $\$ 6,000$;
(C) revoke the license;
(d) deny renewal of the license on expiration thereof; or
(e) impose a combination of any two of the penalties set forth in subsections (1)(a) through (1)(d).
(2) A person licensed under this part and determined by the department to have violated the provisions of this part or the department's rules has a right to a hearing before the department. The hearing must be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Montana Administrative Procedure Act.

NEW SECTION. Section 8. Judicial review of agency decision. (1) Any interested party has the right to judicial review of a final decision of the department concerning the
grant, denial, renewal, revocation, or suspension of a license required under this part.
