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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT CREATING A MECHANISM FOR COLLECTION OF MAINTENANCE CHARGES FROM USERS OF A PRIVATE ROAD."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Definitions. As used in [this act], the following definitions apply:

- (1) "Maintenance charges" means the minimum annual cost to grade and plow the surface of a certain private road to facilitate travel, as determined by the members of a road association, by:
- (a) vehicles of the kind normally used to convey 15 individuals and families; and 16
 - (b) light commercial and recreational traffic.
 - (2) "Private road" means a lane, path, trail, road, street, or highway over which motor vehicles customarily and regularly travel to adjoining, adjacent, or neighboring property and title to which does not reside in a public agency.
 - (3) "Road association" means a de facto organization:
- (a) composed of all road users on a certain private 24 road; and 25

- 1 (b) the purposes of which are to maintain and improve 2 that private road, to receive and expend funds contributed by road users, and to determine maintenance charges.
- (4) "Road user" means a person who owns or occupies 4 for residential, business, commercial, or recreational purposes property crossed by, fronting on, or tributary to a certain private road.
- Section 2. Petition to county commissioners protection of public health and safety -- declaration. (1) If 10% of the road users petition the county 10 commissioners to find and declare that failure or refusal of 11 certain road users to pay maintenance charges causes 12 conditions creating a threat to public health or safety, the 13 county commissioners shall investigate the alleged threat. 14
 - (2) After investigation and upon a finding that necessity for such action exists, the county commissioners shall declare that protection of public health and safety requires that every road user pay his proportionate share of the maintenance charges within 15 days from the date of the finding and declaration.
- 21 Section 3. Sheriff to enforce payment -- civil penalty -- disposition. (1) The sheriff shall notify every road 22 user who fails to pay his proportionate share of the 23 maintenance charges within 15 days of the finding and 24 declaration of the county commissioners provided in [section 25

- 2) that failure to pay in full has caused a civil penalty of \$100 to be assessed against him and that civil proceedings are commencing to enforce payment of the maintenance charges and the civil penalty.
- 5 (2) Upon collection, the maintenance charges must be delivered to the road association and the balance consisting of the civil penalty, after deduction of costs, must be shared equally by the road association and the county general fund.

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
