[^0]NEW SECTION. Section 2. Class B-11--nonresident big game combination license--deer. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, a person not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102, but who will be 12 years of age or older prior to September 15 of the season for which the license is issued may, upon payment of the fee of $\$ 175$ and subject to the limitations prescribed by law and department regulation, apply to the fish and game office, Helena, Montana, to purchase a Bill nonresident big game combination license--deer which shall entitle the holder to all the privileges of Class $\mathrm{B}, \mathrm{Class} \mathrm{B}-1$, and Class $\mathrm{B}-7$ licenses. This license includes the nonresident conservation license as prescribed in 87-2-202. Not more than 14, 000 Class $\mathrm{B}-11$ licenses may be sold in any one license year.

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Class b-12--nonresident big game combination license--elk. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, a person not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102, but who will be 12 years of age or older prior to September 15 of the season for which the license is issued may, upon payment of the fee of $\$ 250$ and subject to the limitations prescribed by law and department regulation, apply to the fish and game office, Helena, Montana, to purchase a B-12 nonresident big game combination license--elk which shall entitle the holder to all the privileges of Class $B$ and black bear licenses and an elk
tag. This license includes the nonresident conservation license as prescribed in 87-2-202. Not more than 14,000 Class B-12 licenses may be sold in any one license year.

Section 4. Section 87-2-504, MCA, is amended to read: "87-2-504. Class B-7 and B-8--nonresident deer licenses. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, a person not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102, but who will be 12 years of age or older prior to September 15 of the season for which the license is issued and is a holder of a nonresident conservation license may, upon payment of the proper fee or fees and subject to the limitations prescribed by law and department regulation, be entitled to apply to the fish and game office, Helena, Montana, to purchase one each of the following licenses: Class B-7, deer A tag, $\$ 100$; Class $B-8$, deer $B$ tag, $\$ 50$; and will entitle the holder to pursue, hunt, shoot, and kill the game animal or animals authorized by the license held and to possess the carcasses of those animals as authorized by department rules. Unless purchased as part of a B-10 or B-11 license, a Class $B-7$ license must be assigned for use in a specific administrative region or portion thereof."

NEW SECTION. Section 5. Extension of authority. Any existing authority of the department of fish, wildife, and parks to make rules on the subject of the provisions of this act is extended to the provisions of this act.

NEW SECTION. Section 6. Effective date. This act is effective March 1, 198B.

2. The licenses for the 1988 hunting season will be sold before $6 / 30 / 88$.
3. The licenses will be issued through a drawing. The non-resident would be given three choices.
4. Drawing fees would be $\$ 2$ per application similar to other drawings (MCA 87-2-113).
5. 41,000 applications will be received for the 31,000 licenses.
6. Field cost for enforcement of laws remain the same.
