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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING STATE EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION PLANS AND BENEFIT LEVELS; PROVIDING PAY SCHEDULES FOR FISCAL YEARS 1988 AND 1989; AMENDING SECTIONS 2-18-301, 2-18-303 THROUGH 2-18-305, 2-18-312 THROUGH 2-18-315, AND 2-18-703, MCA; REPEALING SECTION 2-18-311, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 2-18-301, MCA, is amended to read:

"2-18-301. Purpose and intent of part -- rules. (1) The purpose of this part is to provide the compensation necessary to attract and retain competent and qualified employees in order to perform the services the state is required to provide to its citizens.

- (2) It is the intent of the legislature that, for the biennium ending June 30, 1987 1989, the:
- (a) pay schedules provided for in 2-18-311 <u>2-18-312</u> through 2-18-315 supersede any other plan or systems established through collective bargaining after the adjournment of the 49th <u>50th</u> legislature;
- (b) pay levels provided for in 2-18-3+1 2-18-3+2 through 2-18-3+5 may not be increased through collective bargaining after adjournment of the 49th 50th legislature; and
- (c) total funds required to implement the pay schedules provided for in 2-18-311 2-18-312 through 2-18-315 for any employee group or bargaining unit may not be increased through collective bargaining over the amount appropriated by the 49th 50th legislature.
- (3) The department shall administer the pay program established by the legislature on the basis of merit, internal equity, and competitiveness to external labor markets when fiscally able.

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- 1 (4) The department may promulgate rules not inconsistent with the provisions of this part, 2 collective bargaining statutes, or negotiated contracts to carry out the purposes of this part.
- 3 Section 2. Section 2-18-303, MCA, is amended to read:

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- 4 "2-18-303. Procedures for utilizing pay schedules <u>schedule</u>. (1) The pay schedules <u>schedule</u>
 5 provided in 2-18-312 shall be implemented as follows:
 - (a) The pay schedule provided in 2-18-311 2-18-312 indicates the annual compensation for the fiscal year years ending June 30, 1986 1988, and June 30, 1989, for each grade and step for positions classified under the provisions of part 2 of this chapter.
 - (b)-"The pay-schedule provided in 2-18-312-indicates the annual -- compensation -- for the -- fiscal year -- ending -June 30; -- 1987; -- for -each grade and -- step -- for -positions -- classified -- under -- the -- provisions -- of part -- 2- of -- this -- chapter;
- fc)(b) Each new employee shall advance from step 1 to step 2 of a grade after successfully completing 6 months of probationary service. The anniversary date of an employee shall be established at the end of the probationary period in accordance with rules promulgated by the department.
 - (d)(c) (i) The compensation of each employee on the first day of the first pay period in fiscal year 1986 1988 shall be that amount which corresponds to the grade and step occupied on the last day of the preceding fiscal year of 1985 1987.
 - (ii) The compensation of each employee on the first day of the first pay period in fiscal year 1987 1989 shall be that amount which corresponds to the grade and step occupied on the last day of the fiscal year 1985 1988.
 - (iii)-In-compliance-with-rules-adopted-to-implement-this-part;-each-employee-is-eligible-on-his anniversary-date--to--advance--one--step--in--the-pay-matrix-for-fiscal-year-1987;--However;-if-the employee's-anniversary-date-falls-between-(inclusive)-July-1-and-the-first--day--of--the--first--pay period-of-fiscal-year-1987;-he-will-advance-one-step-on-the-first-day-of-that-pay-period-

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- (2) The pay schedules schedule provided in 2-18-311-and 2-18-312 and the provisions of 1 2 subsection (1) of this section do not apply to those institutional teachers, liquor store occupations, or blue-collar occupations compensated under the pay schedules provided in 2-18-313. 3 2-18-314, or 2-18-315.
- (3) The pay schedules provided in 2-18-313, 2-18-314, or 2-18-315 shall be implemented as 5 follows:

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- (a) (i) The pay schedules provided in 2-18-313 indicate the annual compensation for the contracted school term for teachers employed by institutions under the authority of the department of institutions for fiscal years +986 1988 and +987 1989.
- 10 (ii) The compensation of each teacher on the first day of the first pay period in July, 1985 1987, shall be that amount which corresponds to his level of academic achievement and the step 12 occupied on June 30, 1985 1987.
 - (iii) The compensation of each teacher on the first day of the first pay period in July, +986 1988, shall be that amount which corresponds to his level of achievement and the step occupied on June 30, 1985 1987.
 - (b) (i) The pay schedules schedule provided in 2-18-314 indicate indicates the maximum hourly compensation for fiscal years ending June 30, 1986, 1988, and June 30, 1987, 1989, for those employees in liquor store occupations who have collectively bargained separate classification and pay plans.
 - (ii) The compensation of each employee on the first day of the first pay period in fiscal year 1986 1988 or 1987 1989, as the case may be, shall be that amount which corresponds to that grade occupied on the last day of the preceding fiscal year.
 - (c) (i) The pay schedules schedule provided in 2-18-315 indicate indicates the makimum hourly compensation for fiscal years ending June 30, 1986-1988, and June 30, 1987-1989, for employees in apprentice trades and crafts and other blue-collar occupations recognized in the state blue-collar classification plan who are members of units that have collectively bargained separate

1 classification and pay plans.

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- 2 (ii) The compensation of each employee on the first day of the first pay period in fiscal year.
 3 1986 1988 or 1987 1989, as the case may be, shall be that amount which corresponds to that grade occupied on the last day of the preceding fiscal year.
 - (4) (a) (i) No member of a bargaining unit may receive the amounts indicated in the respective pay schedules provided in 2-48-344 2-18-312 through 2-18-315 until the bargaining unit of which he is a member ratifies a completely integrated collective bargaining agreement covering the biennium ending June 30, 4987 1989.
 - (ii) In the event that negotiation and ratification of a completely integrated collective bargaining agreement as required by subsection (4)(a)(i) of this section are not completed by July 1, 1985-1987, retroactivity to that date may be negotiated.
 - (iii) In the event that negotiation and ratification of a completely integrated collective bargaining agreement as required by subsection (4)(a)(i) of this section are not completed by July 1, 1985 1987, members of the bargaining unit involved will continue to receive the compensation they were receiving as of June 30, 1985 1987.
- (b) Methods of administration not inconsistent with the purpose of this part and necessary to properly implement the pay schedules provided in 2-18-312 through 2-18-315 may be provided for in collective bargaining agreements.
- (5) The current wage or salary of an employee shall not be reduced by the implementation of the pay schedules provided for in 2-18-311 through 2-18-315.
 - (6) The department may authorize a separate pay schedule for medical doctors if the rates provided in 2-18-311--and 2-18-312 are not sufficient to attract and retain fully licensed and qualified physicians at the state institutions.
- (7) The department may develop programs which will enable the department to mitigate problems associated with difficult recruitment, retention, transfer, or other exceptional circumstances.

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Insofar as the program may apply to employees within a collective bargaining unit, it shall be a negotiable subject under 39-31-305."

Section 3. Section 2-18-304, MCA, is amended to read:

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"2-18-304. Longevity allowance. (1) In addition to the compensation provided for in 2-18-317, 2-18-312, 2-18-313, 2-18-314, or 2-18-315, each employee who has completed 5 years of uninterrupted state service shall receive the larger of \$10 a month or 10% of the difference between the base compensation for his grade and step (where applicable) and the base compensation for the next highest grade and corresponding step (where applicable) multiplied by the number of completed, contiguous 5-year periods of uninterrupted state service. Service to the state is not interrupted by authorized leaves of absence.

- (2) (a) For the purpose of determining years of service under this section, an employee must be credited with 1 year of service for each period of:
- (i) 2,080 hours of service following his date of employment; an employee must be credited with 80 hours of service for each biweekly pay period in which he is in a pay status or on an authorized leave of absence without pay, regardless of the number of hours of service in the pay period; or
 - (ii) 12 uninterrupted calendar months following his date of employment in which he was in a pay status or on an authorized leave of absence without pay, regardless of the number of hours of service in any one month. An employee of a school at a state institution or the university system must be credited with 1 year of service if he is employed for an entire academic year.
- 20 (b) State agencies, other than the university system and a school at a state institution,
 21 shall use the method provided in subsection (2)(a)(i) to calculate years of service under this
 22 section."
- 23 Section 4. Section 2-18-305, MCA, is amended to read:
- 24 "2-18-305. Allocation between wages and group benefits. (1) The dollar amounts shown in the respective pay schedules provided in 2-18-31+; 2-18-312, 2-18-313, 2-18-314, or 2-18-315, as the

case may be, represent the maximum amount allocated by the state for wages and group benefits, exclusive of longevity as defined in 2-18-304. Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, that amount specifically allocated for group benefits shall be determined by 2-18-703. An employee who elects not to be covered by a state employee group benefit plan will receive as wages the amount shown in the appropriate pay schedule less the state contribution for group benefits as determined by 2-18-703.

(2) Employees may, through collective bargaining, determine the allocation of the amounts shown in the pay schedules provided in 2-18-311, 2-18-312, 2-18-313, 2-18-314, or 2-18-315, as the case may be, between wages and group benefits, except that in no case may the group benefits allocation be less than the amounts provided in 2-18-703."

Section 9. Section 2-18-703, MCA, is amended to read:

1.7

"2-18-703. Contributions. (1) Each agency, as defined in 2-18-601, shall contribute the amount specified in this section towards the group benefits cost.

(2) For employees defined in 2-18-701, other than members of collective bargaining units, and for members of the legislature, the employer contribution for group benefits shall be \$185 \$115 per month for the fiscal year years ending June 30, 1986 1988, and June 30, 1989, and \$115 per month for each fiscal year thereafter. Permanent part-time employees who are regularly scheduled to work less than 20 hours a week are not eligible for the group benefit contribution. An employee who elects not to be covered by a state-sponsored group benefit plan may not receive the state contribution as wages. A portion of the employer contribution for group benefits may be applied to an employee's costs for participation in Part B of medicare under Title XVIII of the Social Security Act of 1965, as amended, if the state group benefit plan is the secondary payer and medicare the primary payer.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11 Section 1. Section 2-18-301, MCA, is amended to read:

"2-18-301. Purpose and intent of part -- rules. (1) The purpose of this part is to provide the compensation necessary to attract and retain competent and qualified employees in order to perform the services the state is required to provide to its citizens.

- (2) It is the intent of the legislature that, for the biennium ending June 30, 1987 1989, the:
- (a) pay schedules provided for in 2-18-9++ 2-18-312 through 2-18-315 supersede any other plan or systems established through collective bargaining after the adjournment of the 49th 50th legislature;
 - (b) pay levels provided for in 2-18-311 through 2-18-315 may not be increased through collective bargaining after adjournment of the 49th 50th legislature; and
- (c) total funds required to implement the pay schedules provided for in 2-18-3++ 2-18-312 through 2-18-315 for any employee group or bargaining unit may not be increased through collective bargaining over the amount appropriated by the 49th 50th legislature.
 - (3) The department shall administer the pay program established by the legislature on the basis of merit, internal equity, and competitiveness to external labor markets when fiscally able.

- (ii) The compensation of each employee on the first day of the first pay period in fiscal year 1986 1988 or 1987 1989, as the case may be, shall be that amount which corresponds to that grade occupied on the last day of the preceding fiscal year.
- (c) (i) The pay schedules schedule provided in 2-18-315 indicate indicates the maximum hourly compensation for fiscal years ending June 30, 1986 1988, and June 30, 1987 1989, for employees in apprentice trades and crafts and other blue-collar occupations recognized in the state blue-collar classification plan who are members of units that have collectively bargained separate

classification and pay plans.

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- (ii) The compensation of each employee on the first day of the first pay period in fiscal year 1986 1988 or 1987 1989, as the case may be, shall be that amount which corresponds to that grade occupied on the last day of the preceding fiscal year.
- (4) (a) (i) No member of a bargaining unit may receive the amounts indicated in the respective pay schedules provided in 2-18-311 through 2-18-315 until the bargaining unit of which he is a member ratifies a completely integrated collective bargaining agreement covering the biennium ending June 30, 1987 1989.
- (ii) In the event that negotiation and ratification of a completely integrated collective bargaining agreement as required by subsection (4)(a)(i) of this section are not completed by July 1, 1985-1987, retroactivity to that date may be negotiated.
- (iii) In the event that negotiation and ratification of a completely integrated collective bargaining agreement as required by subsection (4)(a)(i) of this section are not completed by July 1, 1985 1987, members of the bargaining unit involved will continue to receive the compensation they were receiving as of June 30, 1985 1987.
- (b) Methods of administration not inconsistent with the purpose of this part and necessary to properly implement the pay schedules provided in 2-18-313 through 2-18-315 may be provided for in collective bargaining agreements.

(1) In addition to the compensation provided for in 2-18-311, 2-18-312, 2-18-313, 2-18-314, or 2-18-315, each employee who has completed 5 years of uninterrupted state service shall receive the larger of \$10 a month or 10% of the difference between the base compensation for his grade and step (where applicable) and the base compensation for the next highest grade and corresponding step (where applicable) multiplied by the number of completed, contiguous 5-year periods of uninterrupted state service. Service to the state is not interrupted by authorized leaves of absence.

- (2) (a) For the purpose of determining years of service under this section, an employee must be credited with 1 year of service for each period of:
- (i) 2,080 hours of service following his date of employment; an employee must be credited with 80 hours of service for each biweekly pay period in which he is in a pay status or on an authorized leave of absence without pay, regardless of the number of hours of service in the pay period; or
- (ii) 12 uninterrupted calendar months following his date of employment in which he was in a pay status or on an authorized leave of absence without pay, regardless of the number of hours of service in any one month. An employee of a school at a state institution or the university system must be credited with I year of service if he is employed for an entire academic year.
- 20 (b) State agencies, other than the university system and a school at a state institution,
 21 shall use the method provided in subsection (2)(a)(i) to calculate years of service under this
 22 section."
- 23 Section 4. Section 2-18-305, MCA, is amended to read:
- "2-18-305. Allocation between wages and group benefits. (1) The dollar amounts shown in the respective pay schedules provided in 2-18-311; 2-18-312, 2-18-313, 2-18-314, or 2-18-315, as the

case may be, represent the maximum amount allocated by the state for wages and group benefits, exclusive of longevity as defined in 2-18-304. Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, that amount specifically allocated for group benefits shall be determined by 2-18-703. An employee who elects not to be covered by a state employee group benefit plan will receive as wages the amount shown in the appropriate pay schedule less the state contribution for group benefits as determined by 2-18-703.

(2) Employees may, through collective bargaining, determine the allocation of the amounts shown in the pay schedules provided in 2-18-31+; 2-18-312, 2-18-313, 2-18-314, or 2-18-315, as the case may be, between wages and group benefits, except that in no case may the group benefits allocation be less than the amounts provided in 2-18-703."

Section 9. Section 2-18-703, MCA, is amended to read:

"2-18-703. Contributions. (1) Each agency, as defined in 2-18-601, shall contribute the amount specified in this section towards the group benefits cost.

(2) For employees defined in 2-18-701, other than members of collective bargaining units, and for members of the legislature, the employer contribution for group benefits shall be \$185 \$115 per month for the fiscal year years ending June 30, 1986 1988, and June 30, 1989, and \$115 per month for each fiscal year thereafter. Permanent part-time employees who are regularly scheduled to work less than 20 hours a week are not eligible for the group benefit contribution. An employee who elects not to be covered by a state-sponsored group benefit plan may not receive the state contribution as wages. A portion of the employer contribution for group benefits may be applied to an employee's costs for participation in Part B of medicare under Title XVIII of the Social Security Act of 1965, as amended, if the state group benefit plan is the secondary payer and medicare the primary payer.

- (3) For employees of elementary and high school districts and of local government units, the employer's premium contributions may exceed but may not be less than \$10 per month.
- (4) Unused employer contributions for any state employee shall be transferred to an account established for this purpose by the department and upon such transfer may be used to offset losses occurring to the group of which the employee is eligible to be a member."



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Section 10. Section 2-18-703, MCA, is amended to read:

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"2-18-703. Contributions. (1) Each agency, as defined in 2-18-601, shall contribute the amount specified in this section towards the group benefits cost.

- (2) For employees defined in 2-18-701, other than members of collective bargaining units, and for members of the legislature, the employer contribution for group benefits shall be \$105 \$115 per month for the fiscal year years ending June 30, 1986 1988, and June 30, 1989, and \$115 per month for each fiscal year thereafter. Permanent part-time employees who are regularly scheduled to work less than 20 hours a week are not eligible for the group benefit contribution. An employee who elects not to be covered by a state-sponsored group benefit plan may not receive the state contribution as wages. A portion of the employer contribution for group benefits may be applied to an employee's costs for participation in Part B of medicare under Title XVIII of the Social Security Act of 1965, as amended, if the state group benefit plan is the secondary payer and medicare the primary payer.
- (3) For employees of elementary and high school districts and of local government units, the employer's premium contributions may exceed but may not be less than \$10 per month.
 - (4) Unused employer contributions for any state employee shall be transferred to an account established for this purpose by the department and upon such transfer may be used to offset losses occurring to the group of which the employee is eligible to be a member."

- 19 NEW SECTION. Section 12. Effective date. This act is effective on passage and approval.
