4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO LIMIT THE GENERAL 5 FUND BUDGET OF A SCHOOL DISTRICT; TO ALLOW THE TRUSTEES OF A 6 DISTRICT TO EXTEND FOR THE ENSUING SCHOOL YEAR, WITHOUT 7 ELECTOR APPROVAL, ANY ADDITIONAL LEVY FINANCING THAT MEETS 8 THE CONDITIONS OF THE GENERAL FUND BUDGET LIMITATION; 9 AMENDING SECTION 20-9-353, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN 10 APPLICABILITY DATE."

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

13 Section 1. Section 20-9-353, MCA, is amended to read: 14 "20-9-353. Additional levy for general fund -election for authorization to impose. (1) The Except as 15 provided in [section 2], the trustees of any district may 16 propose to adopt a general fund budget in excess of the 17 18 general fund budget amount for such district as established by the schedules in 20-9-316 through 20-9-321 for any of the 19 20 following purposes:

(a) building, altering, repairing, or enlarging anyschoolhouse of the district;

(d) proper maintenance and operation of the school
 programs of the district.

3 (2) When Subject to the provision of [section 2], when 4 the trustees of any district determine that an additional amount of financing is required for the general fund budget 5 6 that is in excess of the statutory schedule amount, the 7 trustees shall submit the proposition of an additional levy to raise such excess amount of general fund financing to the 8 electors who are qualified under 20-20-301 to vote upon such 9 10 proposition except that no election shall be required to 11 permit the school trustees to use any funds available to 12 finance the additional amount other than those funds to be raised by the additional levy. Such special election shall 13 14 be called and conducted in the manner prescribed by this title for school elections. The ballot for such election 15 shall state only the amount of money to be raised by 16 17 additional property taxation, the approximate number of mills required to raise such money, and the purpose for 18 19 which such money will be expended, and it shall be in the following format: 20

22 Shall a levy be made in addition to the levies 23 authorized by law in such number of mills as may be 24 necessary to raise the sum of (state the amount to be raised 25 by additional tax levy), and being approximately (give

5 (3) If the election on any additional levy for the 6 general fund is approved by a majority vote of those 7 electors voting at such election, the proposition shall 8 carry and the trustees may use any portion or all of the 9 authorized amount in adopting the preliminary general fund 10 budget. The trustees shall certify the additional levy amount authorized by such a special election on the budget 11 12 form that is submitted to the county superintendent, and the 13 county commissioners shall levy such number of mills on the 14 taxable value of all taxable property within the district, 15 as prescribed in 20-9-141, as are required to raise the amount of such additional levy. 16

17 (4) Authorization to levy an additional tax under the 18 provisions of this section shall be effective for only 1 19 school fiscal year and shall be authorized by a special 20 <u>single</u> election conducted before August 1 of the school 21 fiscal year for which it is effective."

22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 2. Limitations on general fund 23 budget increase -- election waiver -- conditions that 24 require an election. (1) The trustees of a district may not 25 adopt a general fund budget for the ensuing school fiscal

year which exceeds the percentage increase from the current 1 year's budget that has been determined as the percentage 2 increase in the GPI, except that the trustees may adopt a 3 general fund budget at least as large as the schedule amount 4 allowed in 20-9-316 through 20-9-321 for the ensuing school 5 fiscal year. Whenever a current year's general fund budget 6 includes funding for any of the purposes allowed in 20-9-353 7 (1)(a) through (1)(c), those budget items must be subtracted 8 from the current year's general fund budget before applying 9 the percentage increase allowed in this subsection for the 10 general fund budget for the ensuing school fiscal year. 11

12 (2) If the trustees determine that, after meeting the 13 requirements of subsection (1), the additional levy amount 14 required to finance the general fund budget does not exceed 15 the dollar amount of additional levy financing for the 16 current school fiscal year, the trustees:

17 (a) are not required to submit a proposition to the
18 electors as set forth in 20-9-353; and

(b) may require the county commissioners to set anadditional levy that meets the requirements of this section.

21 (3) If an additional levy amount is authorized and 22 levied for 4 consecutive years without requiring electoral 23 approval, a proposition for an additional levy must be 24 submitted to the electors the following year, regardless of 25 the amount of financing required.

1 (4) For the purposes of this section, "GPI" means the 2 implicit price deflator for government purchases of goods 3 and services as published quarterly in the Survey of Current 4 Business by the bureau of economic analysis of the United 5 States department of commerce.

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 3. Codification instruction. 7 Section 2 is intended to be codified as an integral part of 8 Title 20, chapter 9, part 3, and the provisions of Title 20, 9 apply to section 2.

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 4. Applicability. This act 11 applies to the general fund budget for the 1989 school 12 fiscal year, which must be based on the general fund budget 13 for the 1988 school fiscal year for compliance with this 14 act.
