(2) The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to 16 17 forklifts and front-end and rear-end loaders or line trucks 18 and bucket trucks. For the purposes of this section, "line 19 trucks" are hoisting and digging devices mounted on a 20 standard manufacturer's truck chassis with an all-weather 21 cab capable of transporting a driver and two or more crewmen. Line trucks are equipped with a hydraulically 22 23 operated, telescoping boom which uses a nonmetallic cable 24 for hoisting. The telescoping boom does not extend more than 36 40 feet in length when fully extended, as measured from 25

pivot pin to the center of the furthest pulley or sheave. Line trucks may be equipped with a rotary digging device and are capable of attaining maximum allowable highway speeds. "Bucket trucks" are personnel-lifting devices designed to lift personnel to work stations above ground. Bucket trucks are not designed for the purposes intended for a line truck."
