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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Violation to charge medicare beneficiary in excess of approved medicare rates. (1) (a) It is a violation of this part for a health care provider to charge a medicare patient more than the rate approved for payment for the applicable treatment under the federal medicare program (Title XVIII of the federal Social Security Act).

- (b) For the purposes of this section, a health care provider is a person or organization that provides goods or services that are subject to payment or reimbursement under the federal medicare program to individual medicare beneficiaries.
- (2) Every health care provider must post a copy of this section in a conspicuous area in his place of business.
