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1 AMENDING SECTIONS 19-9-304, 19-9-601, AND 19-9-602, MCA; AND BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 10 Section 1. Section 19-9-601, MCA, is amended to read 11 "19-9-601. Member Member's contributions -- additional 12 deduction. (1) The normal contribution of each active member 13 is 6% of his monthly compensation or, in the case of a 14 member first employed by an employer as a police officer 15 after June 30, 1979, 7 1/2% of his monthly compensation, 16 excluding overtime, holiday payments, shift differential 17 payments, compensation time payments, and payments in lieu 18 of sick leave and annual leave, for his services as a police 19 20 officer. (2) Each employer, pursuant to section 414(h)(2) of 21 the federal Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended and 22 applicable on July 1, 1985, shall pick up and pay the 23 contributions which would be payable by the member under 24 subsection (1) for service rendered after June 30, 1985. 25



- (3) The member's contributions picked up by the employer must be designated for all purposes of the retirement system as the member's contributions, except for the determination of a tax upon a distribution from the retirement system. These contributions must become part of the member's accumulated contributions but must be accounted for separately from those previously accumulated.
- (4) The member's contributions picked up by the employer must be payable from the same source as is used to pay compensation to the member and must be included in the member's wages as defined in 19-1-102 and his monthly compensation as defined in 19-9-104. The employer shall deduct from the member's compensation an amount equal to the amount of the member's contributions picked up by the employer and remit the total of the contributions to the board.
- (5) In addition to the member's contribution required under subsection (1), an employer shall deduct an amount equal to 0.5% from the monthly compensation, excluding overtime, holiday payments, shift differential payments, compensation time payments, and payments in lieu of sick leave and annual leave, of each active member. The employer shall pay this amount on a monthly basis to the treasurer of the Montana police protective association to be used to pay premiums on a group life insurance policy for members and to

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defray expenses incurred by the association when
representing members of the plan."

Section 2. Section 19-9-304, MCA, is amended to read:
"19-9-304. Termination of employment prior to
retirement. Upon termination of the employment of an active
member prior to his retirement date, he shall withdraw the
amount of his member member's contributions in lieu of all
other benefits under the plan. If he has 10 years or more of
service, the amount paid shall include regular interest, at
a rate to be determined by the board, on such amounts. If he
has less than 10 years of service, he shall receive only the
amount paid through salary deductions, without interest. If
an active member's employment terminates by reason of his
death, his beneficiaries are entitled to the benefits
prescribed in 19-9-911."

Section 3. Section 19-9-602, MCA, is amended to read:
"19-9-602. Vesting and withdrawal of contributions. A
member is at all times fully vested in the deductions made
from his compensation as a member and paid to the board or
made as a member of a prior plan standing to his credit and
may, at his discretion, withdraw the full amount of these
deductions upon his termination of employment in accordance
with 19-9-304 and forfeit all rights and interest with
respect to any benefits which would otherwise secome payable
under the plan."

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Extension of authority. Any existing authority of the public employees' retirement board to make rules on the subject of the provisions of this act is extended to the provisions of this act.

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 5. Effective date. This act is 6 effective July 1, 1987.

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
