DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act permitting a vested member to qualify employment service with the Montana Cooperative Extension Service under the Teachers' Retirement System.

ASSUMPTIONS:

The number of members who may qualify additional service under this legislation is unknown.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Unknown for FY88 and FY89.

LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Members purchasing additional service credit may be eligible for retirement benefits earlier than the average member who is not eligible to purchase service credits. As the average age of retirees decreases, the liabilities of the Montana Teachers' Retirement System increase and additional funding would be required to remain actuarially sound.
