In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB464, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

This bill requires the appointment of a manager and assistant for each wildlife management area controlled by the Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- The current wildlife management areas that exceed 10,000 acres include Blackfoot-Clearwater, Beartooth, Blacktail, Mount Haggin, Blackleaf, Freezout, Sun River, and Gallatin.
- To comply with this bill we would have to hire five additional managers, and six new assistants; as Sun 2. River and Freezout already have managers and assistants, and Beartooth has a manager only.
- All managers and assistants would live on the wildlife management area. Six areas already have a residence 3. for one person (Blackfoot-Clearwater, Blackleaf, Sun River, Beartooth, Freezeout, and Gallatin).
- The Beartooth already has two residences. 4.
