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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS TO ERECT SIGNS IDENTIFYING MOUNTAIN RANGES ALONG PRIMARY AND INTERSTATE HIGHWAYS."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Signs identifying mountain ranges. Subject to the provisions of federal law, the department shall design and erect at relevant locations two signs, one clearly visible to traffic from each direction, identifying each mountain range that is visible to an occupant of a vehicle traveling on a primary or interstate highway in Montana.

Section 2. Extension of authority. Any existing authority of the department of highways to make rules on the subject of the provisions of this act is extended to the provisions of this act.

Section 3. Codification instruction. Section 1 is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 60, chapter 2, part 2, and the provisions of Title 60, chapter 2, part 2, apply to section 1.

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB493, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act that requires the Department of Highways to design and erect, at relevant locations, two signs, one in each direction, that identifies each mountain range that is visible to an occupant of a vehicle traveling on a Primary or Interstate Highway in Montana.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. There are 39 Mountain Ranges that were identified on the 1985-1986 official highway map.
- 2. It is estimated that each range will require an average of 3 locations (6 signs) to adequately identify them. Total signs will be 234.
- 3. The sign size for the Interstate will be 10' by 3' and for the Primary will be 8' by 2' 6". Color will be silver letters on brown background as per the requirements of the manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. Signs of this size require a 2 post installation.
- 4. Costs for fabrication and installation are at today's rates. No inflation figure was utilized. Fabrication and installation to be done with highway maintenance personnel. Sign costs are derived from actual material costs. Sign fabrication labor is average time spent on signs of this size. Installation costs were derived from the maintenance management system and include travel time.
- 5. It is estimated that 15% or 36 of the signs will be on the Interstate and 85% or 198 signs will be on the Primary.
- 6. Funding will be 100% from the State.
- 7. Half the signs would be installed in FY88 and half in FY89.

LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Would require annual maintenance on signs due to vandalism and impact by vehicles. No costs were determined at this time. Refurbishing would cost \$18,456 in FY95 and \$18,456 in FY96. Removal and installation costs would be \$7,753.59 each year of FY95 and FY96.


