successor to that index. The cost-of-living increment for
the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for each
subsequent fiscal year must be added to all cost-of-living
increments granted for previous years.

# DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act establishing the method by which a sheriff shall determine the compensation of deputy sheriffs; providing that the minimum salary will increase annually based on a percentage of the consumer price index.

## ASSUMPTIONS/FISCAL IMPACT:

Because no statewide data are available on deputy entry level base salaries and level at which current deputy sheriff salaries are in relation to sheriff salaries by county population type, no fiscal impact can be estimated.

### EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUE OR EXPENDITURES:

1989 biennium impact assumed to be minimal.

### LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Statutory inflation adjustments tied to CPI will affect local government personal services costs for deputy sheriffs beginning in FY89.

TECHNICAL OR MECHANICAL DEFECTS IN PROPOSED LEGISLATION OR CONFLICTS WITH EXISTING LEGISLATION: None noted.
