(2) Money appropriated for the purposes of this section may not be used to supplant general operating funds of recipient public libraries. The commission may withhold a distribution to a library that receives less support from a mill levy or local government appropriation than its average for the preceding 3 fiscal years if such a decrease may reasonably be linked to money received or expected to be received.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. State aid -- per capita -- per square mile. The commission shall distribute grants to public libraries on a per capita and per square mile basis.

NEW SECTION. Section 3. State interlibrary loan program -- reimbursement. (1) Each Montana library eligible for reimbursement under this section for participation in the statewide interlibrary loan program must be reimbursed according to the rules adopted by the commission to cover the handling costs of each interlibrary loan whenever the borrowing library is located within Montana.

(2) Libraries eligible for interlibrary loan reimbursement under this section include public libraries, libraries operated by public schools or school districts, libraries operated by public colleges or universities, libraries operated by public agencies for institutionalized persons, and libraries operated by nonprofit private

## STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

#### Form BD-15

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB603, as introduced.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act for state aid to public libraries; providing for a distribution of money on a per capita basis to public libraries; providing for assistance based on an amount per square mile; providing for reimbursement for interlibrary loan lending; providing such aid may not be used to supplant local operating support of libraries; providing for base grants to local libraries for support of federations; providing for a state multi-library card; providing an appropriation; amending Section 22-1-301, MCA; and providing an effective date.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Direct aid to local libraries is computed at \$1.00 per capita based on the last census of each county and \$1.00 per square mile encompassed in each county.
- 2. The amount necessary to reimburse libraries for interlibrary loan lending charges is estimated at \$100,000 a year.
- 3. The estimated amount to reimburse for the statewide library card is \$150,000 per year.
- 4. The amount of library federation base support for each library is estimated at \$1,500 a library.
- 5. The amount allocated to the State Library to administer the program is estimated to be \$15,000 in personal services and \$7,918 in operating costs.

1. The maintenance of effort section within the bill means county and city funding for public libraries will continue at present levels and state funds will not replace local funds for library service.


### LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:
