Section 1. Attorney general -- appointment of special peace officers. The attorney general may appoint special peace officers as provided in [this act].

Section 2. Application for appointment. A class I railroad corporation, as defined by the interstate commerce commission in part 1201 of 49 CFR, desiring the appointment of an officer or employee as a special peace officer shall apply to the attorney general. The application must state the name, age, and place of residence of the person applying for appointment. The applicant must have at least 3 years of experience as a class I railroad peace officer or have completed a training course at an approved law enforcement academy, or meet the qualifications described in 7-32-303 and adopted under 44-4-301. The application must be signed

by the applicant and a managing officer of the railroad corporation. The managing officer signing the application shall at the same time submit an affidavit to the effect that he is acquainted with the person seeking appointment, that he believes him to be of good moral character, and that he is of such character and experience that he can be safely entrusted with the powers and duties of a special peace officer.

Section 3. Limitations on special peace officer. A person appointed and sworn as a special peace officer shall when on duty have the power and authority of a peace officer but may exercise such power and authority only in the protection of the property of the class I railroad corporation employing him.

Section 4. Responsibility of corporation. The class I railroad corporation employing a special peace officer is solely responsible for the compensation of the special peace officer and is civilly liable for any action of the officer arising out of his actions as a special peace officer.
