20	of the obligations, as refinanced, do not exceed 7 years.

3	(3) Notes may not be issued for a single purpose in an

6	issued pursuant to this section exceeds 5% of the most

8	(4) The political subdivision shall, within applicable
9	expenditure and levy limitations, appropriate revenues for
10	the payment of the notes in each fiscal year during which
11	the notes are outstanding in an amount sufficient to pay the
12	principal and interest due on the notes in such fiscal year.
13	(5) The authority to issue notes in this section is
14	not exclusive and is supplemental to other law.
