(1) The board may sell timber 11 12 on state lands, at such a price per 1,000 feet as in its judgment is in the best interest of the state, but not 13 14 otherwise---but--no--such--sale-of-live-timber-shall-be-less 15 than-93-per-1,000-feet-for--white--pine,--yellow--pine,--and spruce--or--less--than--\$1.50--per--1.000-feet-for-all-other 16 17 timber-species, and the price is not subject to adjustment 18 for the duration of the contract. 19 (2) All timber sold or cut from state lands shall be

(2) All timber sold of cut from state lands shall be cut and removed under such rules for the preservation of standing timber and the prevention of fires as the board prescribes. In all cases the board must require the person cutting the timber to pile and burn or otherwise dispose of the brush and slashings in such manner as may be required. (3) Before any sale is granted, the timber shall be

estimated and appraised under the direction of the 1 department, upon the request and subject to the approval of 2 the board. These estimates and appraisals shall show as 1 nearly as possible the amount and values per 1,000 feet of 4 all merchantable timber, together with a statement of the 5 situation of the timber relative to risk from fires or 6 damage of any kind, its distance from the nearest lake, 7 8 stream, or railroad, and its value and position as a 9 protection to a watershed.

10 (4) The board may set fees for brush disposal on state 11 lands. The board may also establish a fee for timber stand 12 improvement on timber cut on state lands. Such fees shall be 13 deposited in the state special revenue fund to the credit of 14 the department."

The proposed legislation would prohibit adjustment of price in a contract for sale of state timber.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The proposed legislation would not influence initial bid price on state timber.
- 2. Impacts of the legislation would not take effect until FY90.
- 3. Fluctuation of lumber prices in the next 5 years will be the same as the last 5 years.

LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Utilizing the method proposed in this bill, it is estimated that income to the trust will be reduced by 1.2 percent for each year beginning FY90, that will result in a loss of approximately \$42,000 in FY90 to the Trust and Legacy Trust Fund. Assuming 10% interest earnings, the School Foundation Program will also decrease by approximately \$4,000 in FY90, and the revenue loss will increase by \$4,000 per year.
