DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to increase the maximum general fund budget schedules for elementary schools and high schools by 5% for school year 1987-88 and by 6% for school year 1988-89.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Assume the average number belonging for public schools is 151,806 in FY88 and 152,592 in FY89.

2. Assume that non-general fund sources of revenue will total \$242,959,000 in FY88 and \$251,559,000 in FY89.

3. Assume the maximum general fund budget without a vote under current law will be \$285,435,000 in FY88 and \$286,185,000 in FY89.
