An act to increase the maximum general fund budget schedules for elementary schools and high schools by $5 \%$ for school year 1987-88 and by 6\% for school year 1988-89

## ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Assume the average number belonging for public schools is 151,806 in FY88 and 152,592 in FY89.
2. Assume that non-general fund sources of revenue will total $\$ 242,959,000$ in FY88 and $\$ 251,559,000$ in FY89.
3. Assume the maximum general fund budget without a vote under current law will be $\$ 285,435,000$ in $F Y 88$ and $\$ 286,185,000$ in FY 89 .
