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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Expanded day-care assistance. (1) In addition to the payments authorized under 53-4-514 and available federal funding, the department shall pay to a licensed day-care facility, for each child eligible to receive public financial support, a portion of the total cost of day care as determined under subsection (2).

- (2) The level of expanded day-care assistance provided under [this act] must decrease as family income increases, according to the following criteria:
- (a) A family whose income is 150% of the AFDC level is eligible for 100% of day-care costs.
- (b) A family whose income is equal to or above 55% of the state's median income for families of like size is not eligible to receive expanded day-care assistance.
- 22 (c) A family whose income is between the levels established under subsections (2)(a) and (2)(b) is eligible to receive expanded day-care assistance based on a 12-step 25 progressive scale ranking income brackets and support



- levels. The department shall develop the 12-step scale in accordance with the Montana Administrative Procedure Act.
- (3) Expanded day care is available to an individual 3 and an employer for the purpose of hiring an employee eligible under department quidelines. This day-care assistance will provide for the gradual assumption of the total cost of day care by the parents of eligible children. Section 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated 8 \$386,000 for the biennium ending June 30, 1989, from the general fund to the department of social and rehabilitation 10 11 services to provide expanded day-care assistance by paying 12 day-care costs to licensed day-care facilities for each
- 13 child eligible to receive public financial support at the level established in accordance with [section 1] and 14 15 53-4-514.
- Section 3. Transfer of funds. The department of social 16 17 and rehabilitation services may transfer money between programs to affect the purposes of this act. 18
- 19 Section 4. Report. The department of social and rehabilitation services shall report to the 51st legislature 20 21 on the costs and benefits of this program.
- 22 Section 5. Extension of authority. Any existing 23 authority of the department of social and rehabilitation services to make rules on the subject of the provisions of 24 this act is extended to the provisions of this act.

Section 6. Codification instruction. Section 1 is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 53, chapter 4, part 5, and the provisions of Title 53, chapter 4, part 5, apply to section 1.

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
