A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PERMITTING AN ATTENDING PHYSICIAN TO ALLOW A PATIENT TO BRING PRESCRIBED MEDICATION TO A HOSPITAL AT THE TIME OF ADMITTANCE; AND REQUIRING THAT THE MEDICATION BE ADMINISTERED TO THE PATIENT BY HOSPITAL PERSONNEL DURING HIS HOSPITALIZATION."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Patient access to medication. (1) A hospital, as defined in 50-5-101, shall, upon authorization of the attending physician, allow a patient to bring prescribed medication to the hospital at the time of admittance. The patient shall give the prescribed medication to the admitting personnel of the hospital at the time of admittance.

- (2) The authorized personnel of the hospital shall administer the patient's medicine to the patient pursuant to the directions of the attending physician who authorized the patient to bring the medication to the hospital.
- (3) The hospital shall return any unused medication to the patient upon his release unless the attending physician orders otherwise.
