WHEREAS, it is widely acknowledged that the citizens and taxpayers of Montana are supporting more county governments than are necessary for efficient management of local affairs; and

WHEREAS, twenty-eight counties were formed between 1910 and 1925 without benefit of a comprehensive plan; and

whereas, the legislature is uniquely qualified to address the question of county consolidation and reorganization from a statewide perspective and to determine what factors ought to be considered in developing a comprehensive plan for consolidation and reorganization; and whereas, a study of factors relevant to a comprehensive plan for county consolidation and reorganization undertaken

in the 1988-89 biennium will facilitate the legislative districting and apportionment required in 1990 by Article V, section 14, of the Montana Constitution.

THEREFORE, the legislature finds that a study of county consolidation and reorganization is of vital importance to the social and economic well-being of the citizens of Montana.
