Section 1. Section 50-5-204, MCA, is amended to read:

"50-5-204. Issuance and renewal of licenses -
inspections. (1) After receipt of a new or renewal

application, the department or its authorized agent shall

inspect the facility without prior notice to the operator or

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act requiring the Department of Health and Environmental Sciences to make unannounced inspections of licensed health care facilities; amending section 50-5-204, MCA; and providing an effective date.
