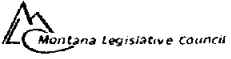

3,000 scientific, engineering, and technical jobs for the state in which it is located; and

WHEREAS, the initial investment of over \$4 billion and ongoing expenses of the facility will inject millions of dollars annually into the economy of the state in which it is located; and

WHEREAS, Montana possesses all the required locational criteria such as open land, abundant power and water, transportation services, university research facilities, a quality labor force, and commitment to excellence necessary to ensure success of the project; and

WHEREAS, it is essential that Montana take full advantage of its many attributes to strengthen and diversify its economy to provide employment opportunities for all its workforce.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Appropriation. (1) There is appropriated to the governor's office ~~\$1--million~~ \$300,000 from the general fund; ~~No--expenditures--from--this appropriation--may--be--made--after--the--biennium--ending--June--30, 1989.~~

(2) ~~Up to \$100,000 of the appropriation shall~~ TO be used by the governor's office for establishment of a 9-member super collider task force, information gathering,
