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9 WHEREAS, service industries that develop and process 10 information will create over 35% of all American jobs by 11 1995, more than any other major industry group; and

WHEREAS, Montana's high quality of life is attractive
to many information resource enterprises, and such
enterprises can locate in Montana if the problem of distance
is overcome; and

16 WHEREAS, knowledge and information are critical 17 resources for improving the productivity and performance of 18 existing Montana industries as well as the ability of those 19 industries to tailor their products to specific national and 20 international markets; and

21 WHEREAS, an information infrastructure comprised of a 22 statewide telecommunications network and of information 23 resources and services can overcome Montana's traditional 24 handicap of distance, enable new enterprises to locate and 25 develop in Montana, and help existing businesses to thrive;

2 WHEREAS, an information infrastructure can improve the 3 access of citizens to education and training and other 4 public services while increasing the efficiency and 5 effectiveness of those services; and

6 WHEREAS, modern telecommunications technology can 7 enable citizens and their organizations to communicate with 8 each other and participate more effectively in the public 9 life of the state, thereby improving the mutual 10 understanding and sense of community among Montanans; and

11 WHEREAS, by harnessing modern information resources and 12 technology, Montana can establish itself as a national and 13 international leader in enhancing its economy and quality of 14 life.

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16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

17 Section 1. Montana information infrastructure
18 commission. There is created the Montana information
19 infrastructure commission.

Section 2. Purpose. It is the purpose of the Montana
information infrastructure commission to:

3 Section 3. Commission members -- composition. The
4 Montana information infrastructure commission consists of 10
5 members appointed as follows:

6 (1) The speaker of the house, the president of the
7 senate, the republican floor leader of the senate, and the
8 house minority leader each shall appoint one member of the
9 50th legislature and one member of the public.

10 (2) The director of the department of commerce shall 11 appoint two members.

12 Section 4. Appropriation. There is appropriated for 13 the biennium ending June 30, 1989, \$150,000 from the general 14 fund to the department of commerce for the Montana 15 information infrastructure committee to effect the purpose 16 provided in section 2.

17 Section 5. Effective date -- termination. (1) This act18 is effective on passage and approval.

19 (2) This act terminates June 30, 1989.
